

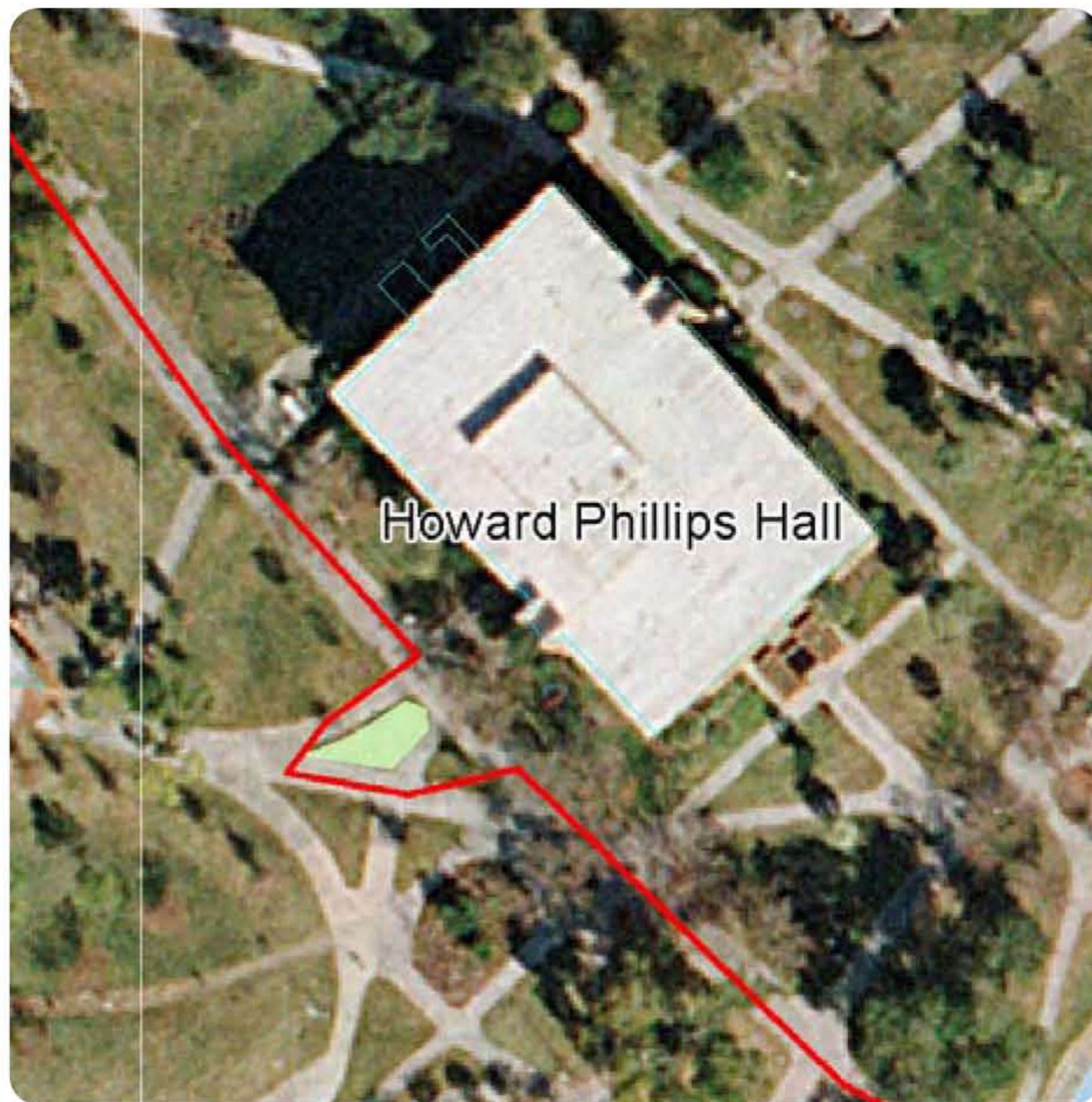

This is an eclectic display of plants that are planted purely for horticultural aesthetics. There is no central theme to the origin of the plants.

Golden Dewdrop *Duranta erecta*

Golden Dewdrop is native to the Americas, from Mexico and the West Indies south to Argentina in South America. There is some debate about whether the plant is native to Florida or an introduced species. Its showy blossoms attract butterflies and hummingbirds.



Queen Sago *Cycas Circinalis*

Though this plant resembles a palm it is actually a cycad. Historically, the pulpy stem has been used to make a type of flour; however the queen sago has also been known to cause adverse neurological affects and paralysis. It is a native to equatorial Africa.
